A fragment is a group of words often mistaken for a sentence. A fragment is either a phrase or a dependent clause that looks or sounds like a sentence. Remember: A sentence contains a subject and a predicate and expresses a complete thought. Turn to page 558 in *Write Source*.

- Complete Sentence:
 The polar bear is a curious animal.
 - Fragments:
 Can be quite a clown (subject missing)
 When the bear is safely confined (dependent clause, not a complete thought)
 Of captive bears exceeding 1,000 pounds (both subject and predicate missing)
